School Uniform

There has been a lapse in wearing the correct Hauroko Valley Primary School uniform.

Hauroko Valley Primary School requires our students to wear a school uniform. This policy and the associated uniform requirements are a school bylaw. Refer to the attached illustration to outline what students can wear to school, and while representing the school. These expectations have been made clear to our students and parents.

As a school, we are proud to wear our school uniform to represent Hauroko Valley. We wear this to represent our people and place and showcase our school values. Hauroko Valley Primary is known for its well-established high expectations for learners and the uniform supports sustaining our place and our people.

Hauroko Valley Primary School Values

Hauora - to show we care about ourselves and others when wearing our uniform in and out of school.

Village - we **connect** to each other and as a team when wearing correct school uniform in unity.

Perseverance - at HVP we **can do**, we can self manage our belongings to be ready for learning including wearing our school uniform daily.

**Bucket hat & shorts**
Navy blue sun hat for all students.
Shorts - polyester satin backed microfibre. Mid-thigh length, elastic waist & 2 hip pockets.

**Polo shirts & socks**
Short sleeve royal blue moisture-wicking cotton polo shirt, with a contrast panel and school logo on left chest.
Socks dark navy or black.

**Skort, stockings & thermal long sleeve top**
Hauroko Valley Primary Skort. Long navy blue stockings for winter.
Thermal long sleeve navy quick drying and lightweight top for under polo or sport tops.

**Polar fleece top & long pants**
Polyester fleece with full zip and 2 side pockets. Long navy blue track pants lined with cotton & side zips. Cotton drill navy blue cargo pants with pockets on either side.

**Raincoat**
Hauroko Valley School beanie for Winter.

**Merino Jumper**
Optional - merino jumper in navy blue with 1/2 zip.

**Year 7&8 Jacket**
Soft shell jacket with bonded inner fleece. Water repellent, wind resistant, concealed hood and shaped back tail. Side and chest zip pockets.

**Footwear**
Hauroko Valley Primary School footwear includes black shoes - sandals, leather shoes, and/or black sneakers.

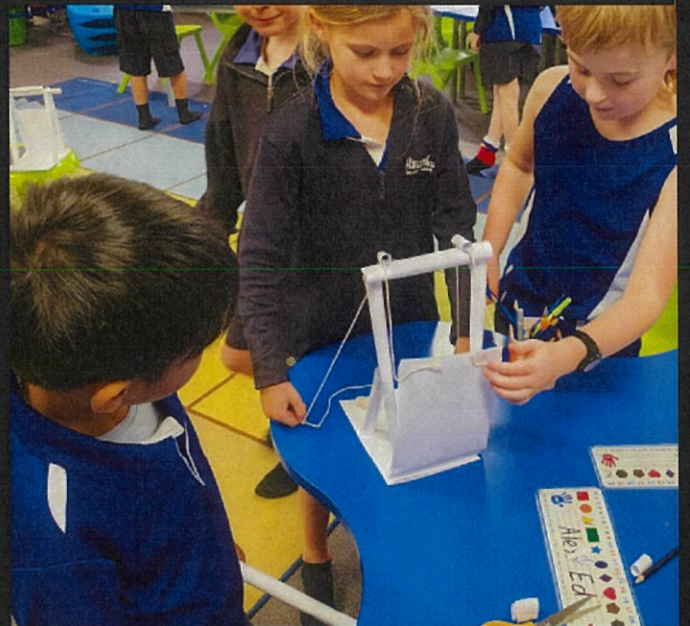

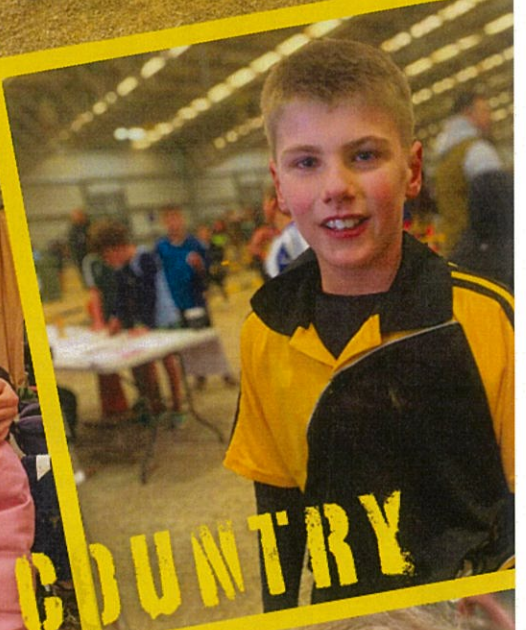
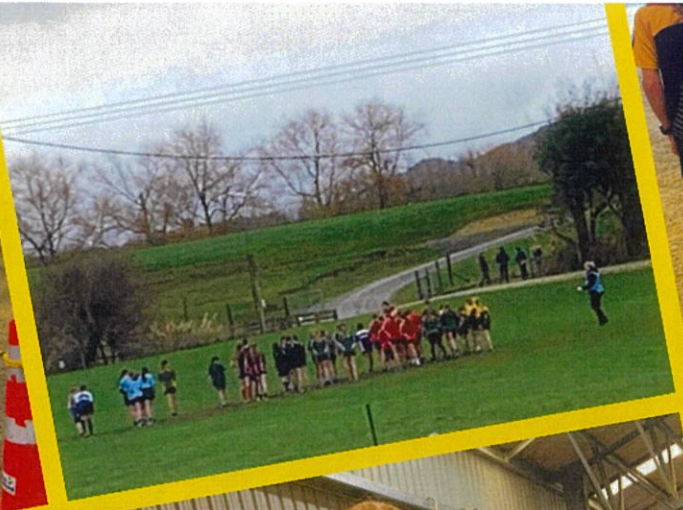


We had a visit last week from Pam Fleck to present our Year 4's with Rotary dictionaries - Thank you very much!

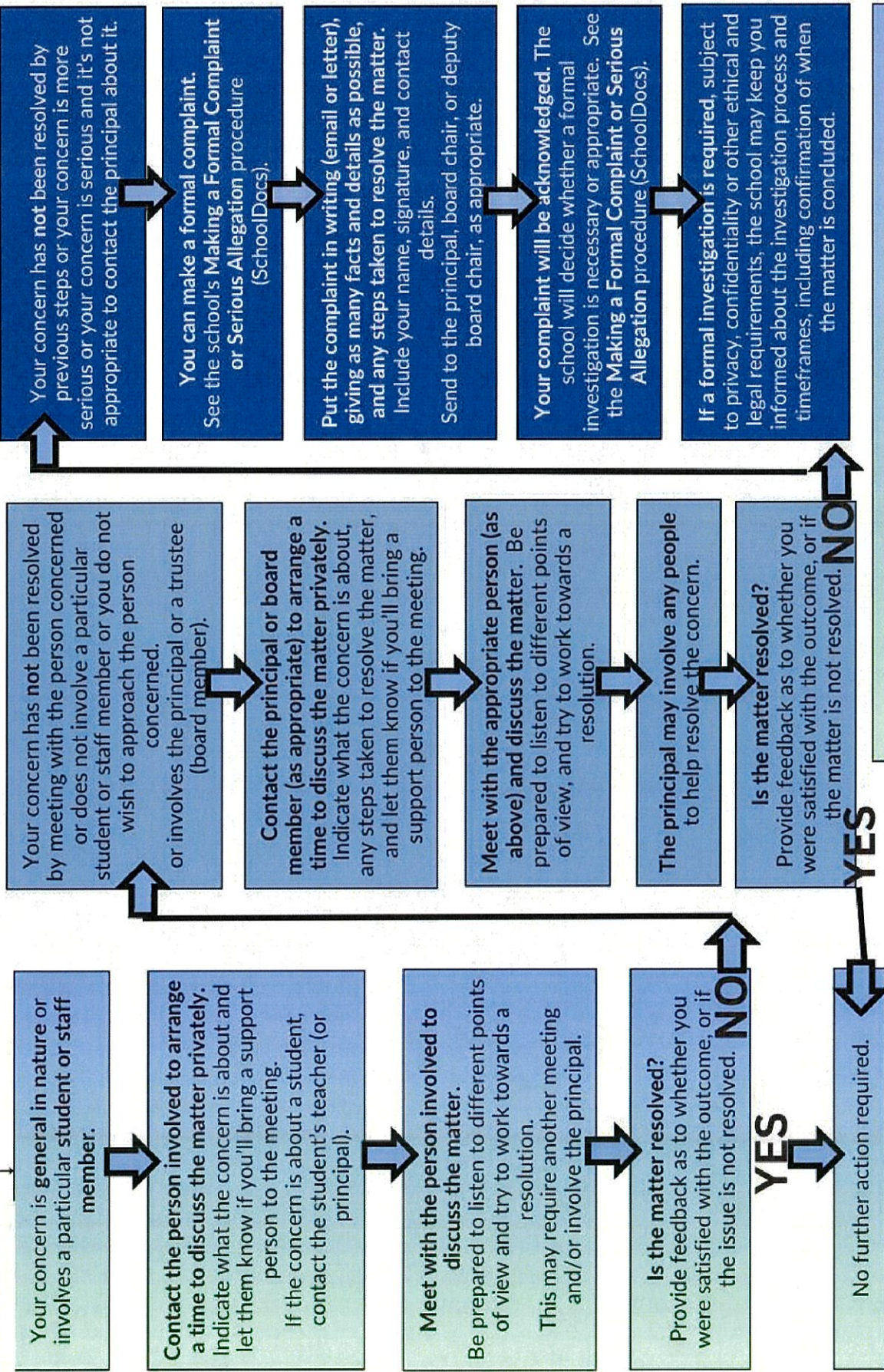

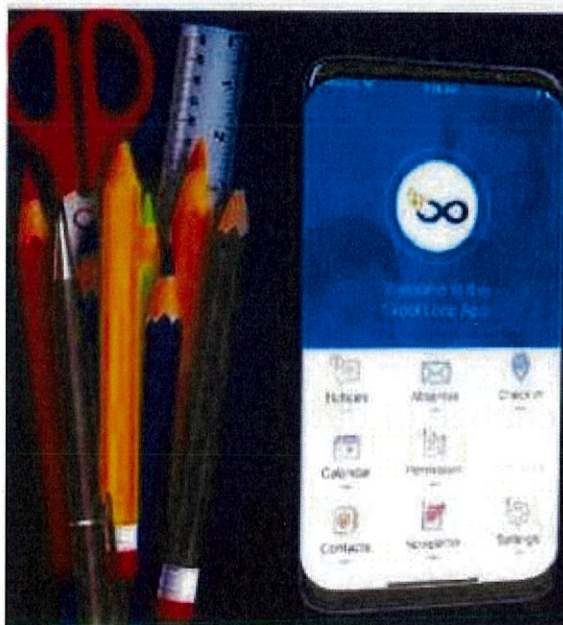
