#### Western Southland Golf



Enjoy the longer weekend, as Labour Day is Monday 28th October. We will see you on Tuesday 29th October.



This week was the Year 4&5's trip to the Science Roadshow and Splash Palace. terrific time the students had a hydroslides and swimming in the pool. The students enjoyed racing down the two single slides to see which was faster, but the Reactor slide was the most popular overall. This year's Science Roadshow covered exciting topics such as visible and invisible light waves that travel through the air and other matter, and the three states of matter - solids, liquids, and gasses.





An amazing highlight of the trip were the interactive exhibitions on display. It was terrific getting hands on with some mindblowing science. During the finale, students learned how physical reactions and chemicals reactions occur between the three states of matter, including whether or not a change can be reversed. We learned how to make elephant toothpaste and that gas can be frozen into a solid without turning into a liquid first. What a marvelous experience!
