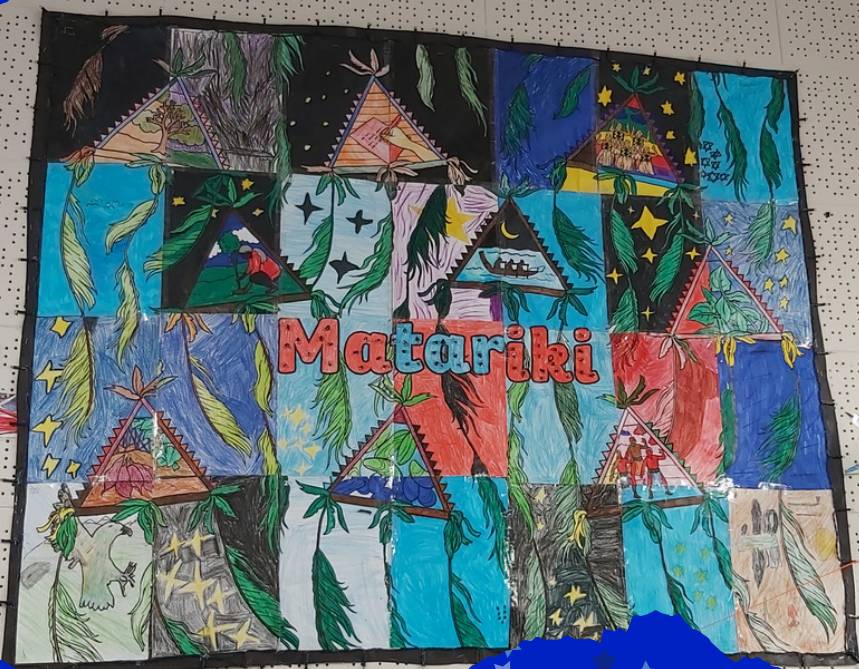
He waiata Matariki!

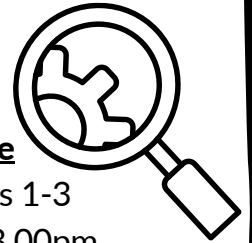

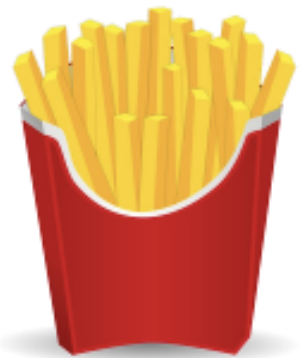
