# Mittre 10 7 ough Kids

The Mitre 10 MEGA Tough Kid® is a fun and challenging obstacle course designed for primary school children. The aim of the day is participation and fun in a "challenge by choice" philosophy that promotes confidence-building and personal achievement.

35 of our Year 4-6 students headed to the 2024 Tough Kids, Mitre 10 challenge at Rugby Park, Invercargill on Wednesday. The course was a sophisticated set up, with obstacles to crawl under, climb up and over, slide down, balance and in between running as fast as possible.

I felt suspense, waiting for the clapper at the start of the course. The course was challenging with the slides twisting and turning. It hurt going up the wooden steps. It was nice to feel the cold water run down your back, as the day got hotter.

I liked the competition, running side on with competitors racing to the finish line. It was fun, getting covered in bubbles at the end of the second slide and diving through the finish line.

The opportunity to try something new, especially for the Year 4's it was their first time at Tough Kids. For the Year 6's, it was their last time.

### Adventure Race

The Southland Secondary School Adventure Race 2024 was held at Sandy Point Golf Club. The race includes disciplines of MTB, trekking, kayaking & navigation - requiring a team of four.   And the most difficult..find the Tuatapere sausage










# Literacy Learning @ Hauroko Valley with Rachel Bell
