HVP Pet Day 2022 - yes we are having a Pet Day in Term 4!

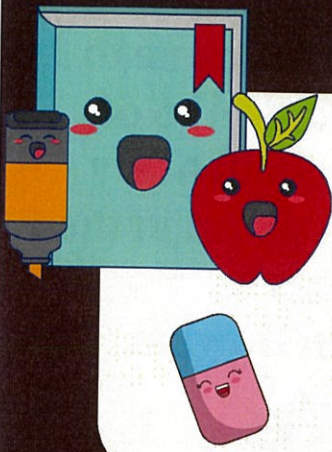

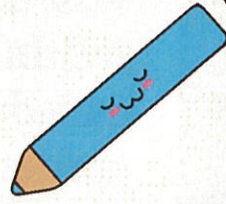
Enjoy the long weekend as Monday 26th September is Queen Elizabeth II Memorial Day.

The donkey saw us, he was so kind. The donkeys are Benny and Kenny. By Abby

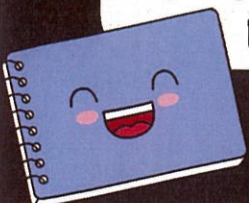
"Hi Sammy, Have you seen my treasure map?" asked Benny the donkey. It is in the war and it is a very dangerous place there. By Memphis

In the garden Barnaby found a ginormous worm. He lives in Christchurch. By Aoife

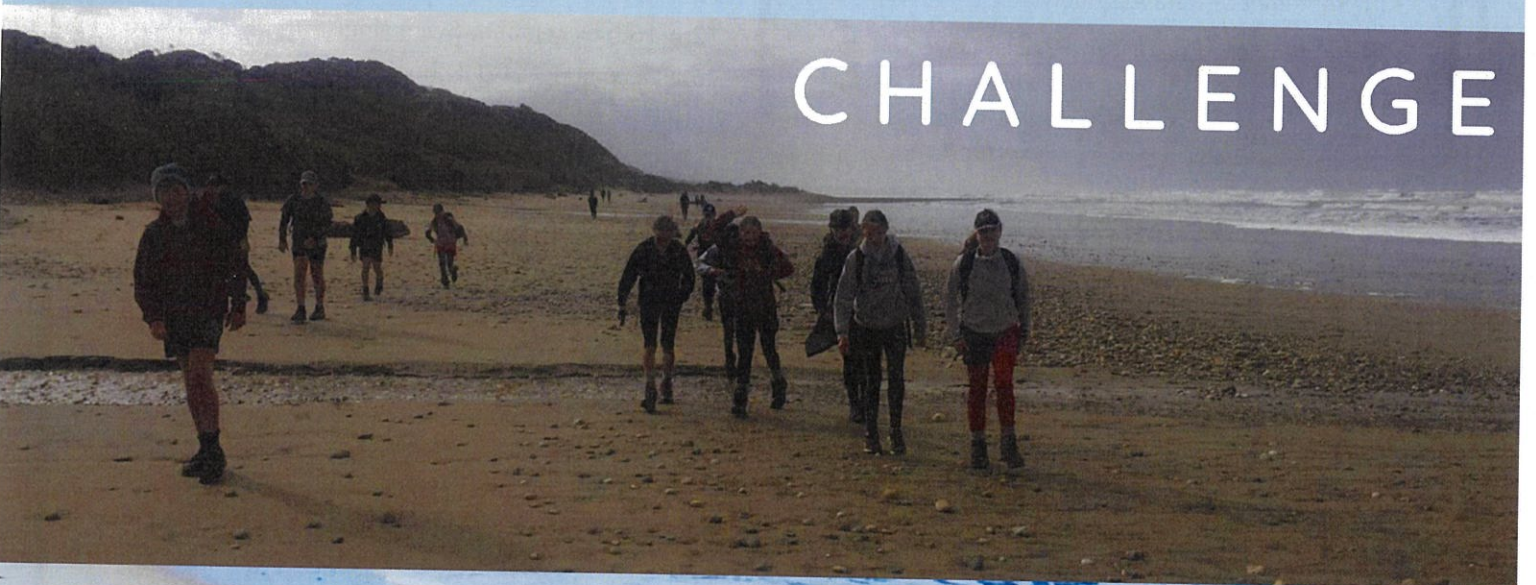


